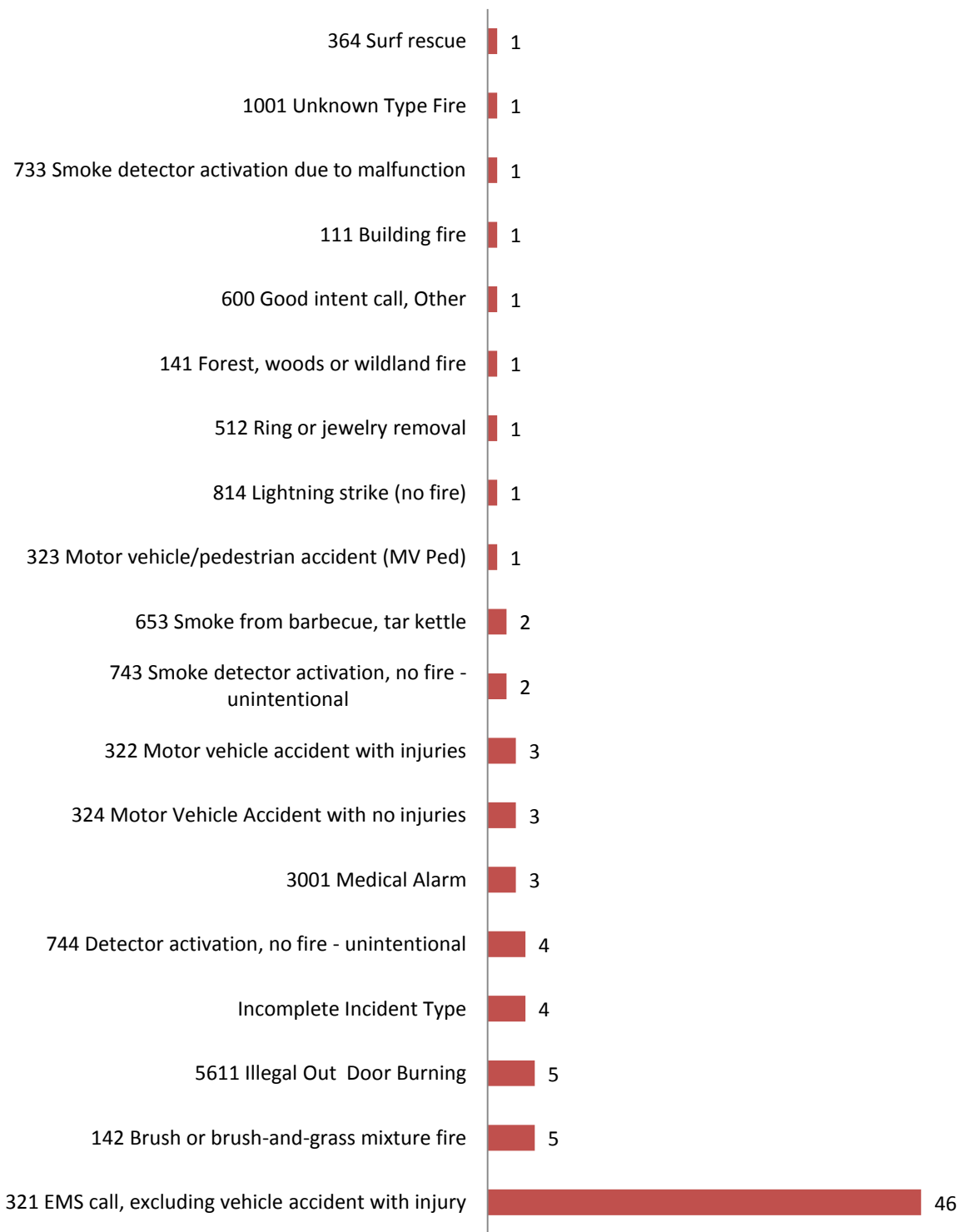

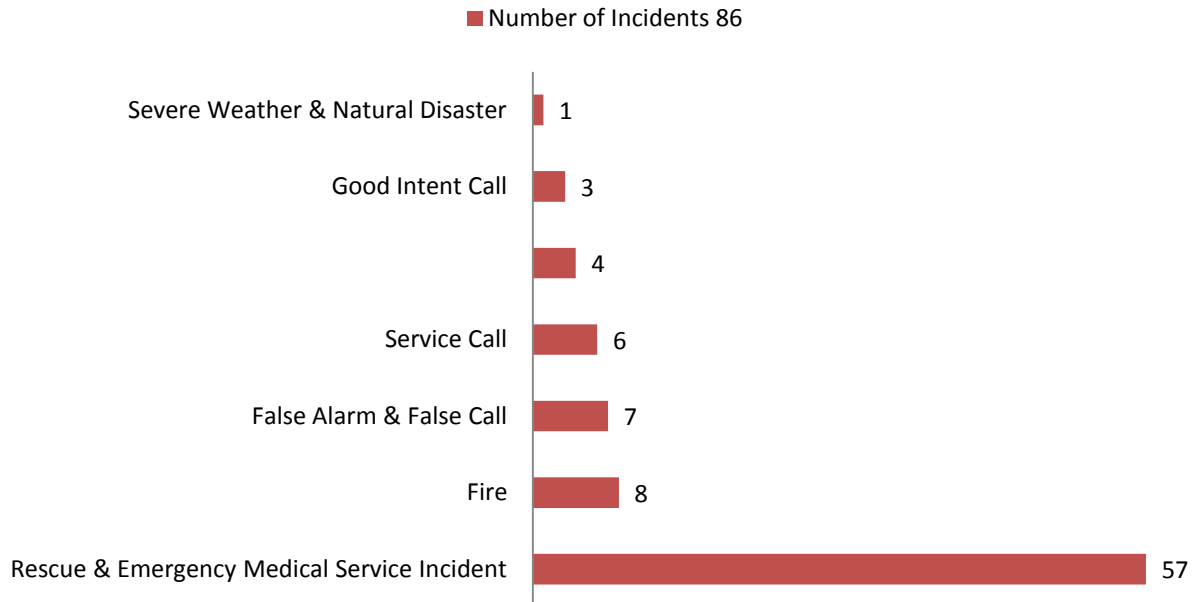
## Incidents Types August 2014

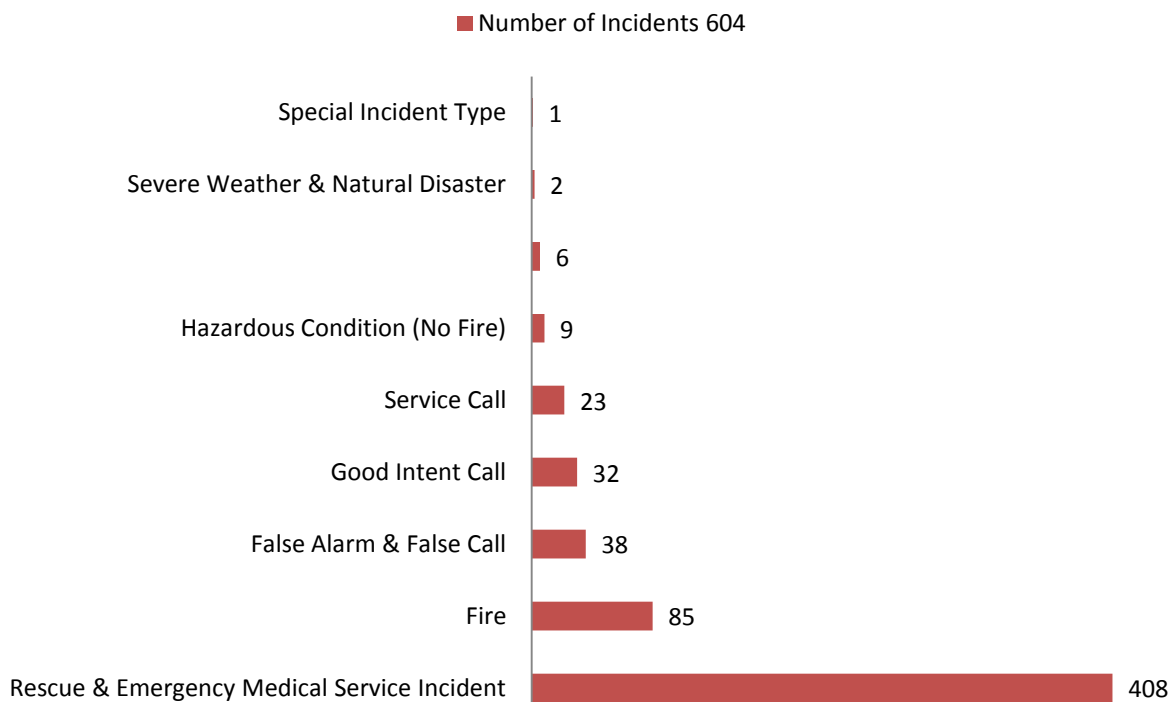




## Incidents Types by Group August 2014



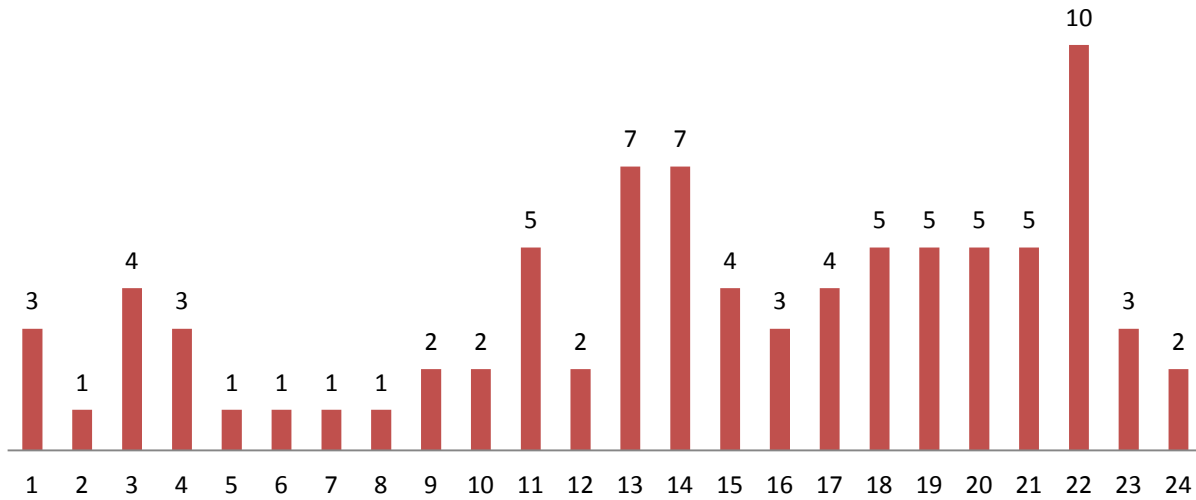
## Incident Types by Group Year To Date





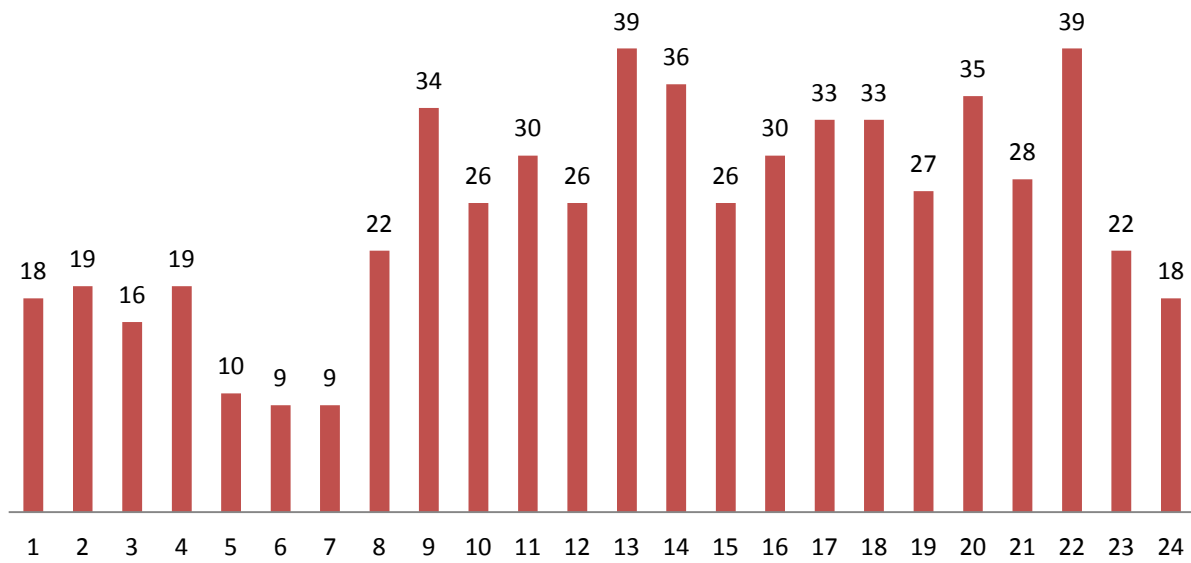
## Incident by Hour of the Day August 2014

## Incident by Hour of the Day Year To Date

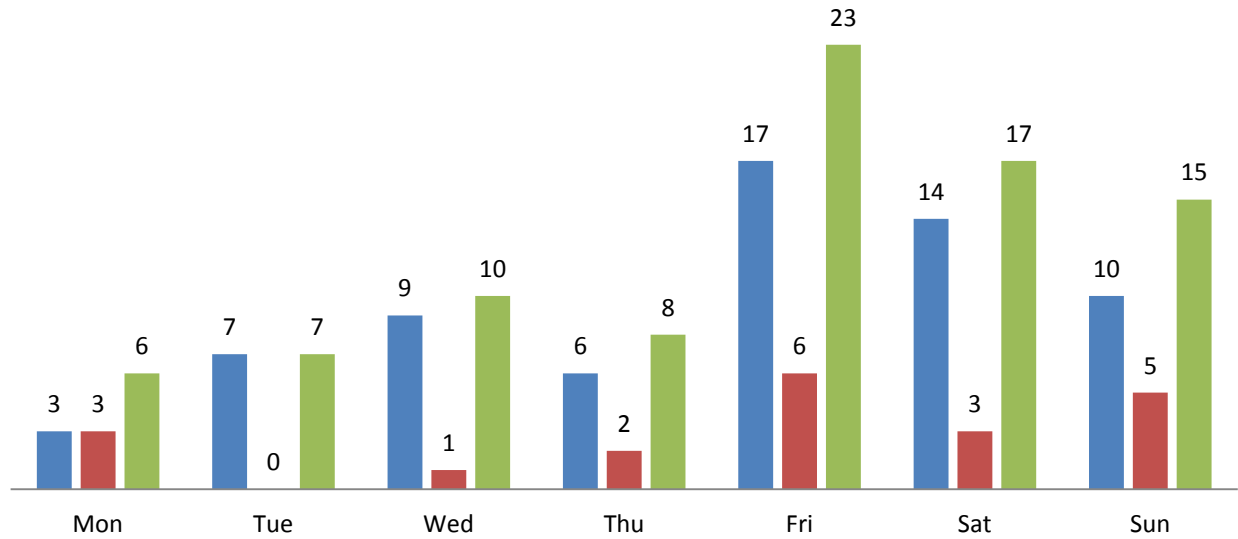

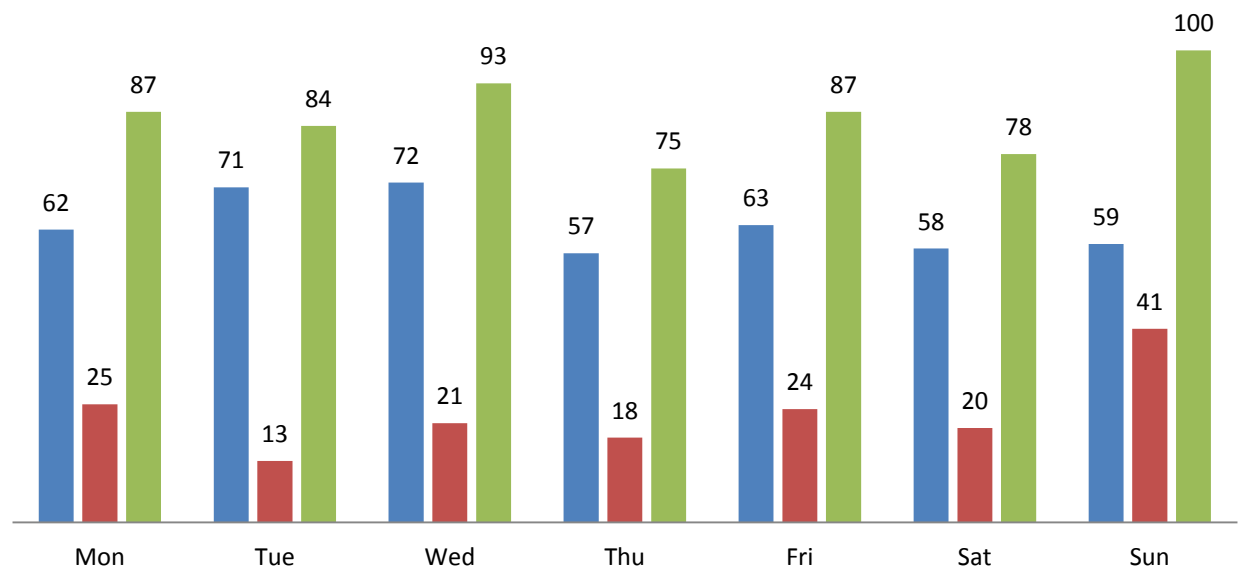
## Day vs. Night Calls by Day of the Week August 2014

■ Day ■ Night ■ Total



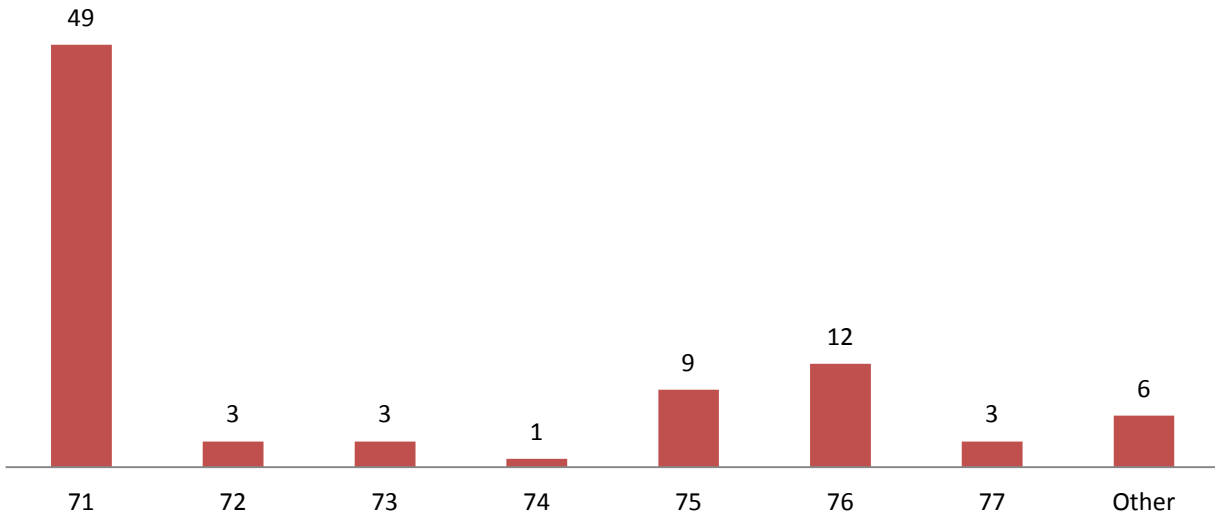
## Day vs. Night by Day of the Week Year To Date

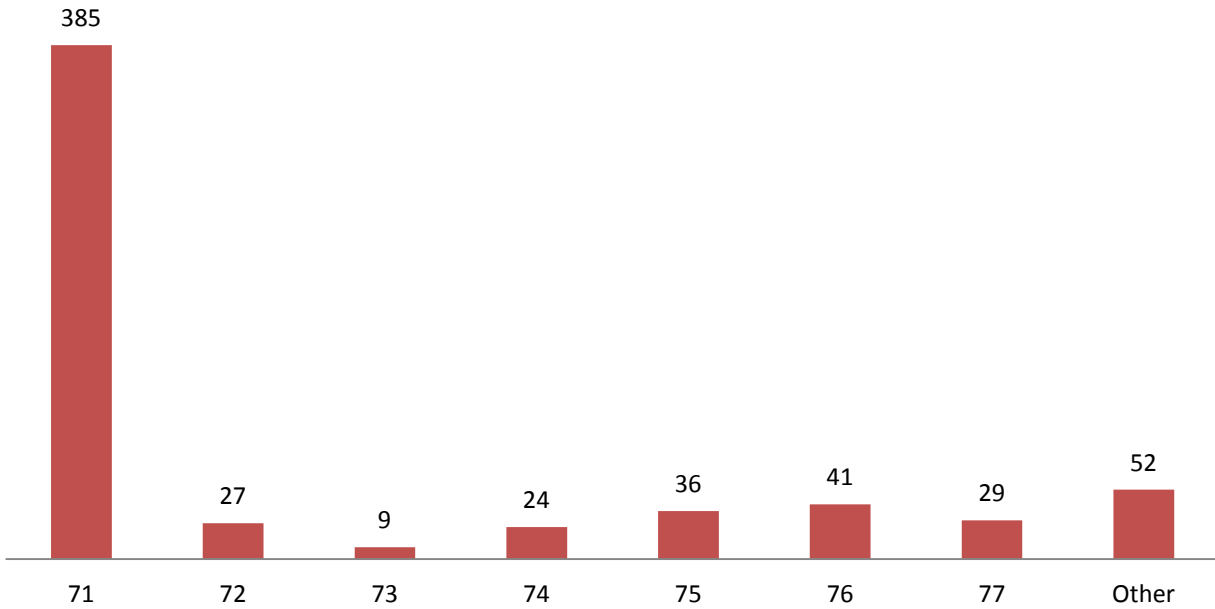




### Incident by First Due Area August 2014

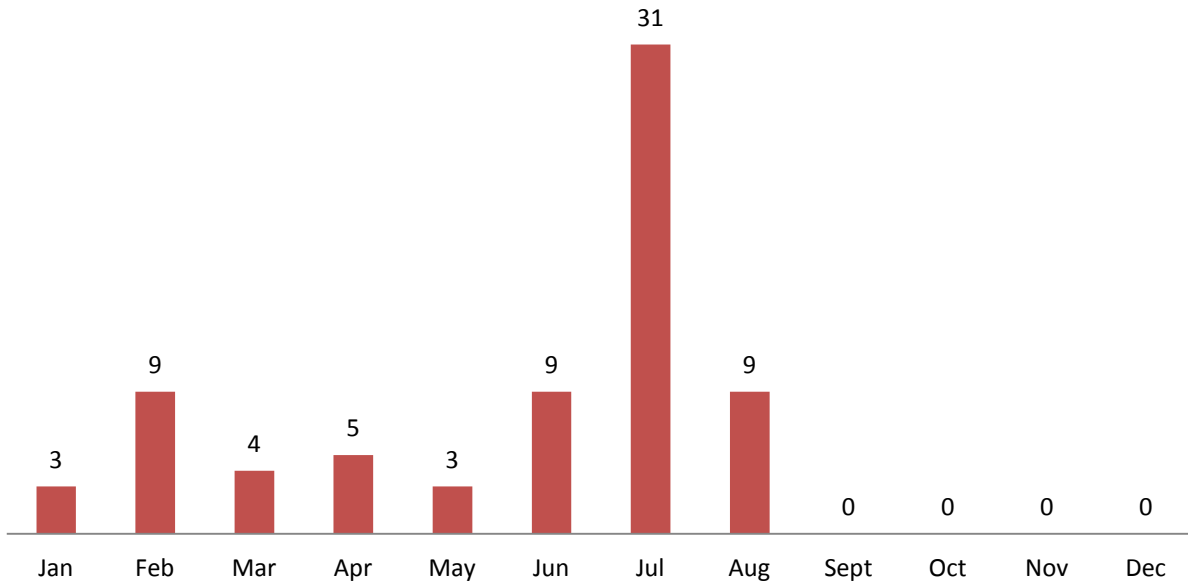


### Incidents by First Due Area Year To Date

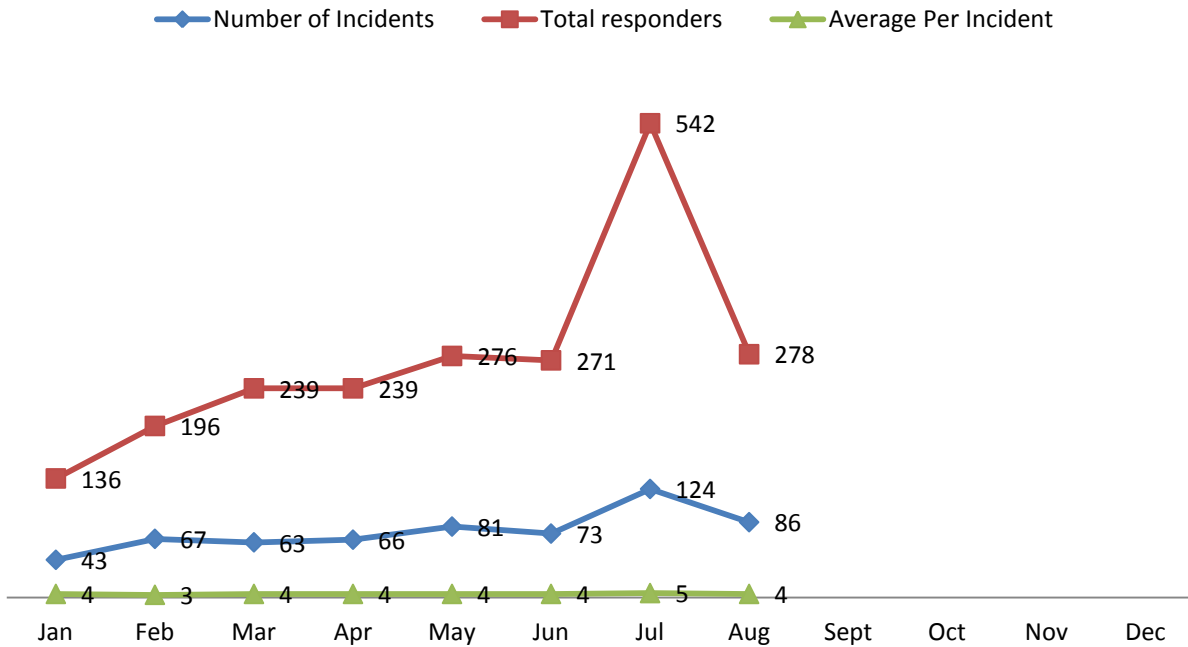




## 2014 Overlapping Incidents



## Average Turnout Per Incident 2014



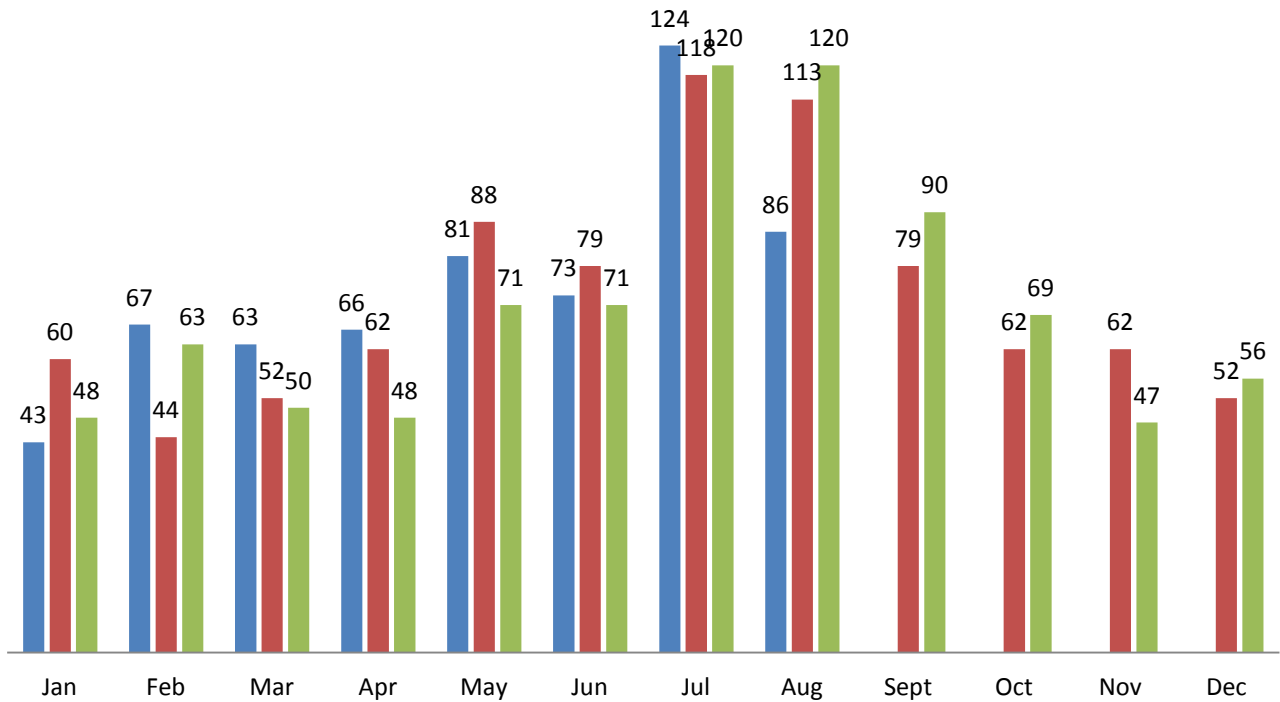

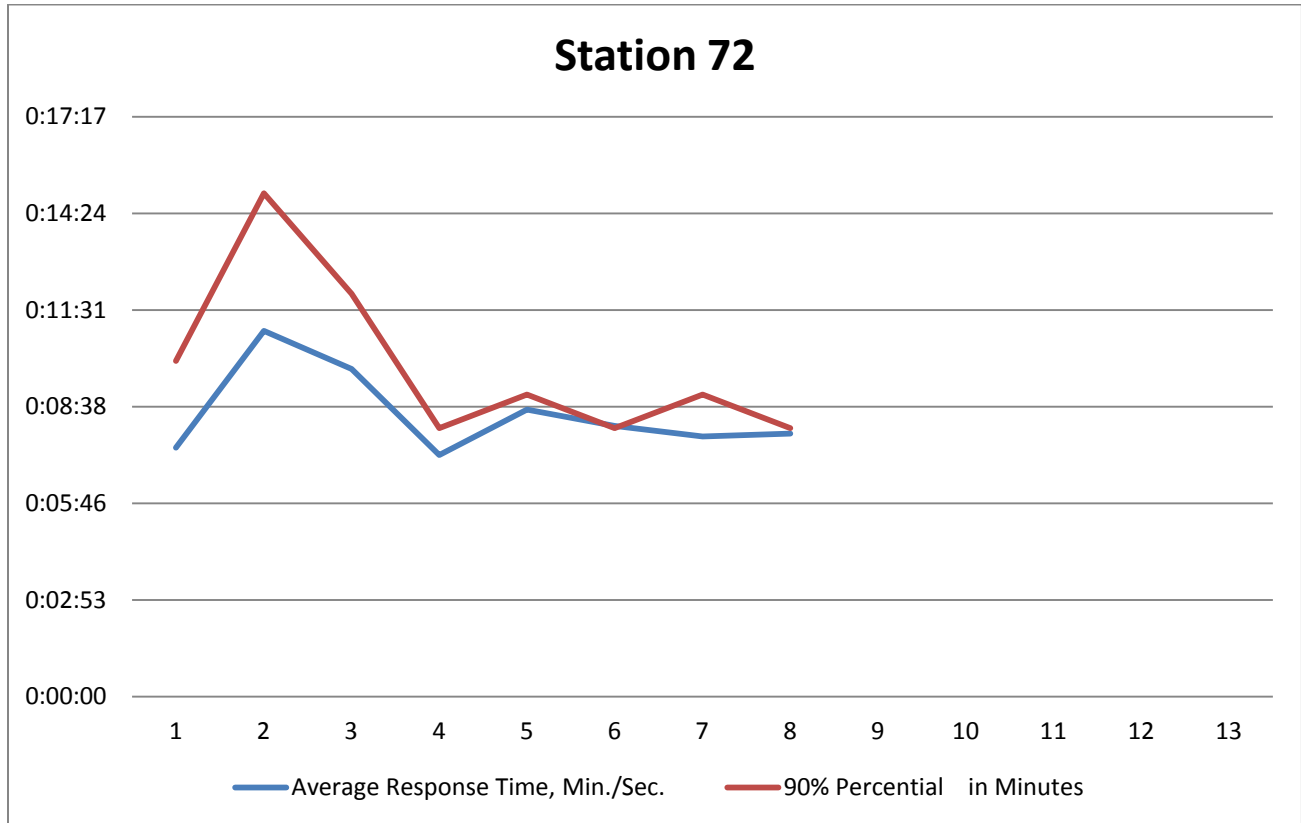
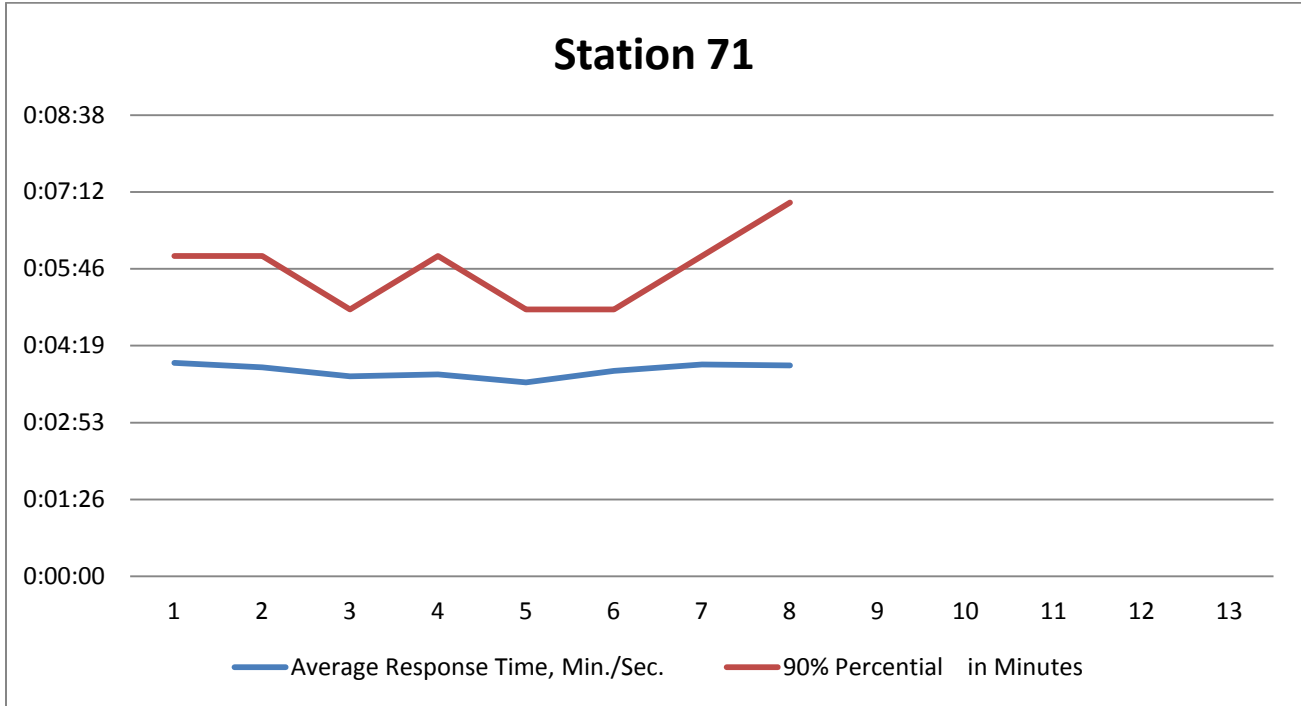
## Total Incidents Per Month

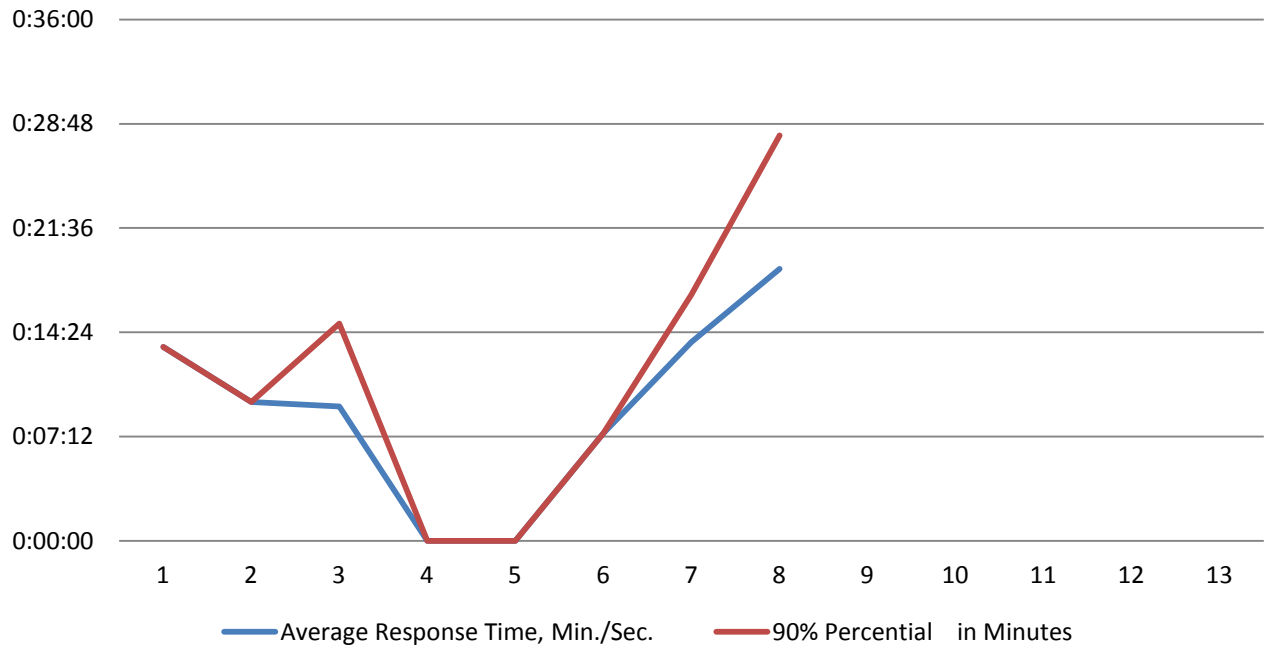




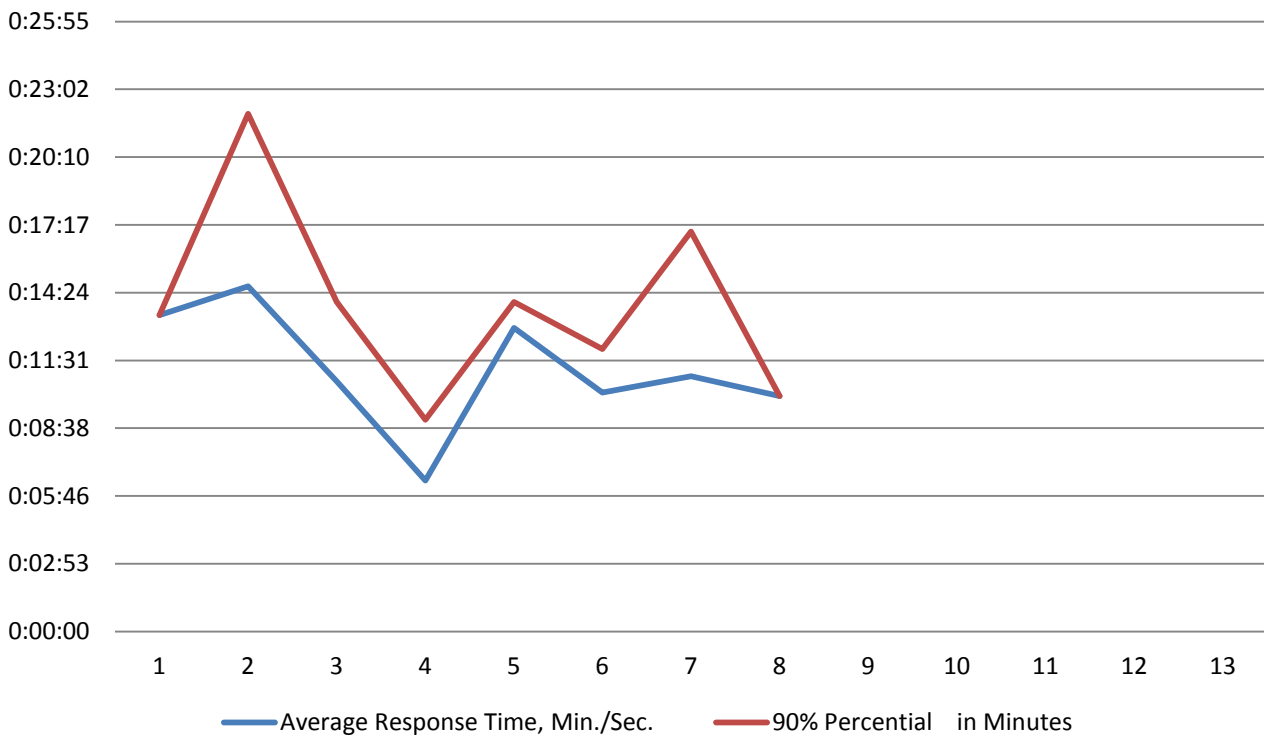
## Emergency Response Average and 90% Arrival Times

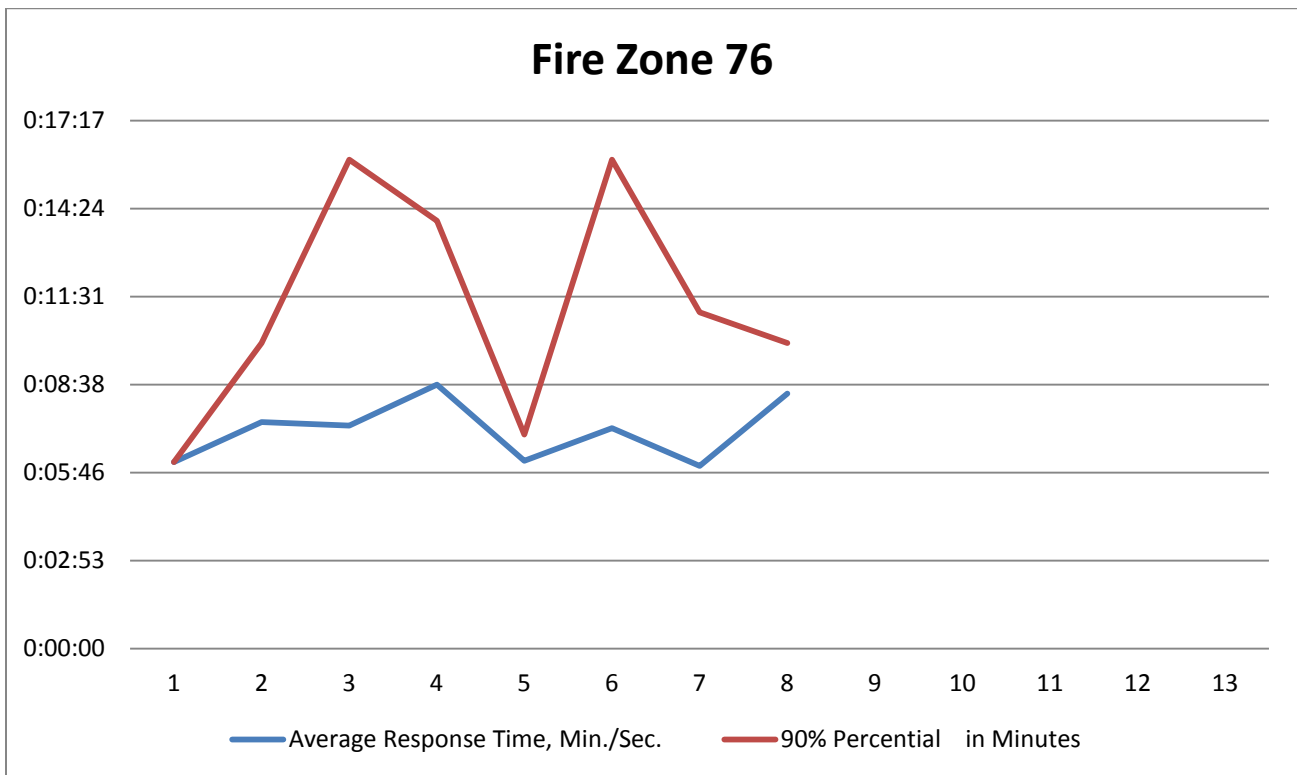
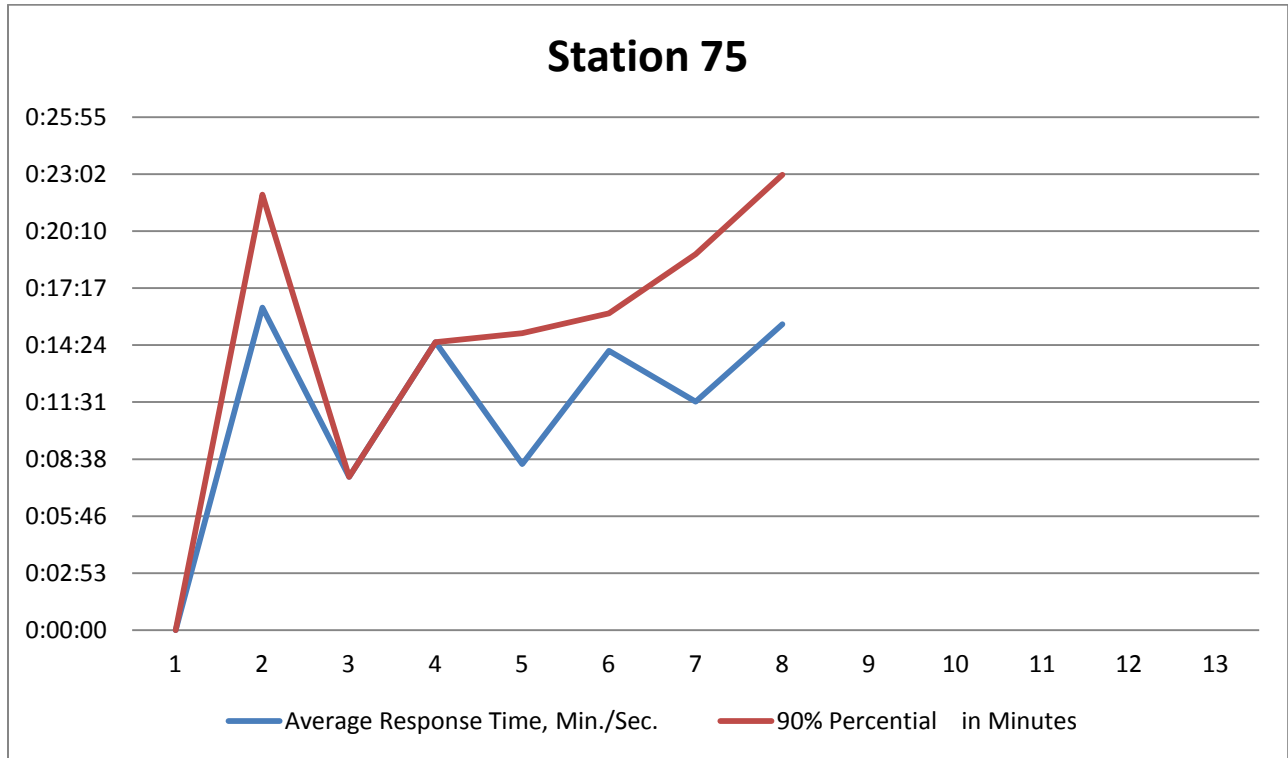

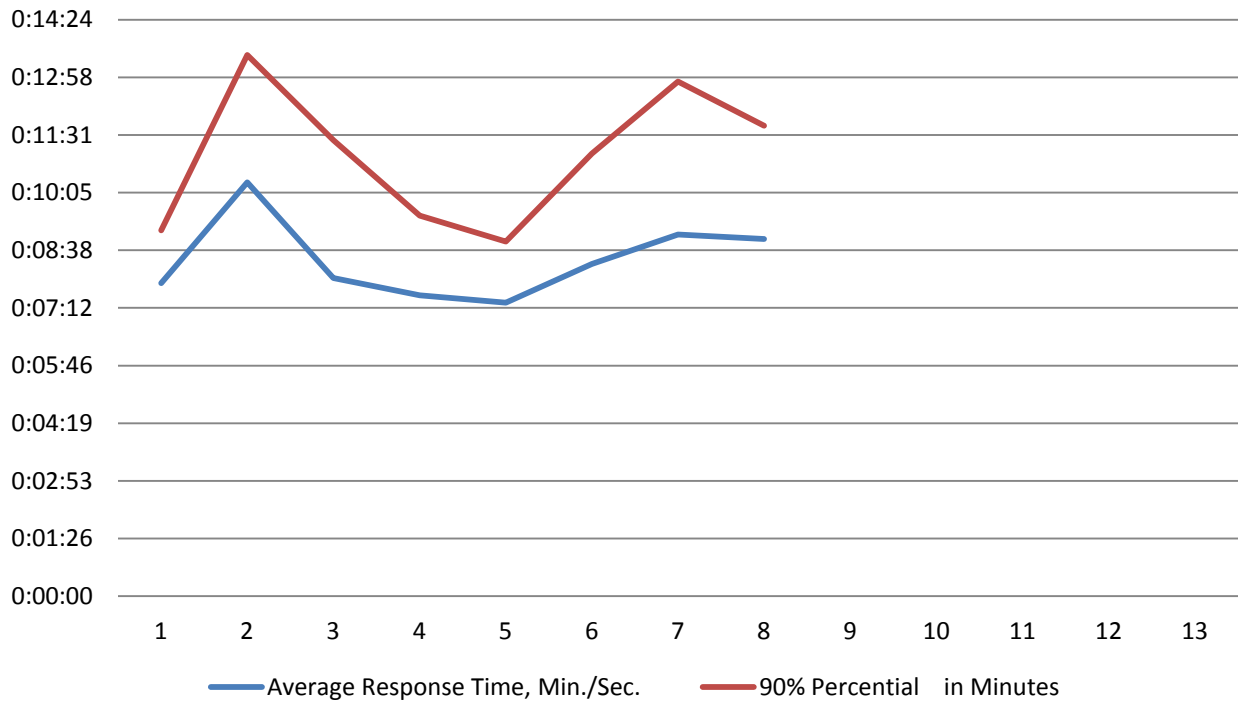




## Fire Zone 77

## **Significant Calls in August, 2014** *and the not so significant*

---

**ATV Accident**, 08/31/2014, around 0224 hours: Chief 701, Rescue 71, EMS Chief 3101, Medic 3171 and Chelan County Sheriff Deputies responded to a report of an ATV accident with two patients. Upon arrival personnel found an ATV that had run head-on into a pile of rail-road trussels. Both patients were treated and transported to Lake Chelan Community hospital with serious injuries.

**Vehicle In the Water**, 08/30/2014, around 1530 hours: Chief 701, Rescue 71, Support 71, Marine 71, Medic 3171 and Chelan County Sheriff Deputies responded to 322 SR-150 for a report of a vehicle in the water submerged, unknown if occupied. Marine 71 launched from Chelan Shores, Support 71 arrived on scene to a vehicle about 10 feet off shore and 10 feet under water. A Rescue Swimmer immediately entered the water and checked the vehicle for occupants. No one was found in the vehicle or in the immediate area. All CFR units returned in service. Vehicle owner was located at home later that day.



**Brush Fire**, 08/16/2014, around 1452 hours: Chief 701, Rescue 71, Brush 71, 73, Tender 75 and US Forestry responded to Union Valley and Cagle Gulch area for a brush fire. First unit on scene found a ¼ acre brush fire in light to medium fuels burning under heavy (tree) fuels about 1,000 feet down a steep hill. Personnel took hand tools down and started containing the fire with a dry line while a hose line was overhauled to the fire. CFR personnel were able to contain the fire with the dry line and hose line. US Forestry brought in a 20 person hand team and two helicopters from the Carlton Complex Fire. US Forestry handled the extinguishment and overhaul. Cause of the fire was from a lightning strike a few days earlier.

**Vehicle vs. Pedestrian**, 08/09/2014, around 1938 hours: Chief 701, Rescue 71, Medic 3171 and Chelan County Sheriff's Deputies responded to 331 Nebraska Ave for a child hit by a car. The child was treated and transported to Lake Chelan Community Hospital with non-life threatening injuries and will make a full recovery.

**Building Wildland Fire**, 08/02/2014 around 1810 hours: Chief 701, Engine 71 responded "auto-aid" to 130 McNeal Canyon Road with Orondo Fire Department for a garage fire spreading to the wildland hill side. Chief 2401 arrived first and expended his water supply to stop the spread of the fire. Chief 701 and Engine 71 arrived next and were able to contain the fire and started extinguishment prior to the arrival of any other apparatus. Chief 2401 and Engine 71 were instrumental in fire containment and not letting the fire spreading to the surrounding wildland area. Cause of the fire is under investigation.

**Motor Vehicle Accident**, 08/01/2014 around 1933 hours: Chief 701, Rescue 71, Engine 71, Medic 3171 and Chelan County Sheriff Deputies responded to Cotter Road and SR-150 for a two vehicle injury auto accident. There were seven involved occupants between the two vehicles. Four individuals were back boarded and transport to Lake Chelan Community Hospital with neck and back pain.
