



Emergency Response Average and 90% Arrival Times




















Brush Fire: 05/31/2014 around 1312 hours, Captain 703 Rescue 71 and Tender 71 responded to 1048 Sunset Lane. CFR Crews were able to contain and extinguish the quarter acre brush fire.



Brush Fire: Mutual Aid; 05/28/2014 around 1810, Engine 72 responded to a three alarm brush fire, to provide structural protection at Mile Post 8 Malaga Alcoa.

Brush Fire: **Auto Aid**; 05/27/2014 around 0938 hours, Captain 703, Rescue 71 and Tender 71 responded to MP 231 SR-97 for a four acre brush fire with the Orondo Fire Department. Crew's were able to contain and extinguish the fire at four acres. Cause of the fire is under investigation by the Orondo Fire Department.



MVA: 05/24/2014 around 1300 hours, Chief 701, Rescue 71, Engine 75, Brush 75 and Medic 3171 responded to 10490 S Lakeshore Road for a single vehicle into a rock motor vehicle accident. The driver was the only occupant and was treated and transported to LCCH.



Brush Fire: 05/24/2014 around 0937 hours, Chief 701, Brush 75, Engine 75, Tender 74, 75 and Medic 3171 responded with a total of 15 personnel to a brush fire at 10830 S Lakeshore Road. A controlled burn had gotten away from the property owner. The fire burned from a water front home driveway and traveled up the





embankment to S Lakeshore Road. CFR's personnel were able to contain and extinguish the fire between the driveway and S Lakeshore Road with minimal fire travel to the east and west. Cause of the fire, controlled burn got out of control.

Brush Fire: 05/24/2014 around 0927 hours, Chief 701, Rescue 71, Brush 71, and Tender 71 responded to a brush fire just west of the new ball fields on the hill side (about 1076 E. Johnson Ave). CFR personnel were able to contain and extinguish the one acre brush fire. Cause of the fire is





undetermined. Before the fire was fully contained CFR was dispatched to another brush fire at 10830 S Lakeshore Road.

MVA: 05/22/2014 around 1806 hours, Chief 701, Rescue 71, Engine 71, and Medic 3171 responded to a two vehicle head-on accident at SR-150 and Chelan Falls Road. Driver of one vehicle was treated and transported to LCCH, the other driver was checked and released at the scene. A by-stander watching the event passed out and was also treated and transported to LCCH.



MVA: 05/21/2014 around 0823 hours, Chief 701, Rescue 71, and Medic 3171 responded to a two vehicle T-Bone accident at S. Bradley and E Woodin. Occupants of the vehicle were checked for injuries and released at the scene.



Semi-Truck Accident with Extrication: Auto Aid; 05/20/2014 around 0858 hours Chief 701, Rescue 71, Engines 71, 74, and Medic 3171 responded to Mile Post 3 McNeal Canyon Road for a semi roll over with entrapment. CFR's crew working with Orondo Fire Department spent 70- minutes extricating the driver from the semi. The driver was taken to CWH and released with only minor injuries later that day.



Camper Fire: 05/12/2014 around 0838 hours Chief 701, Captain 703, and Engine 71 responded to a camper fire in Station 71's rear parking lot (belonged to a student attending training). The camper was heavily charged with smoke. Engine 71's crews extinguished the fire. The camper was heavily damaged with smoke and heat on the interior. The cause of the fire is related to a battery/electrical short.



Barn/Shed Fire: Auto Aid; 05/03/2014 around 2217 hours, Chief 701, Engine 71, and Tender 75 responded to 6005 SR-971. Upon arrival we found a fully involved structure with exposure to the A-Side. Engine 71's crew provided exposure coverage and then initial attack of the fire. The fire scene was turned over to Entiat Fire Department upon their arrival.



Brush Fire: 05/02/2014 around 1802 hours Chief 701, Captain 703, Engine 71, Brush 73, 74 and Tender 71 with a total of 13 personnel responded to the Chelan Football field for a brush fire near the grandstand. CFR was able to contain and extinguish the fire. Cause was undetermined.



House Fire: Auto Aid: 05/01/2014 around 0928 hours Chief 701, Engine 71, and Medic 3171 responded mutual aid to 509 Stayman Flats (Entiat). On arrival we found a kitchen fire that had been knocked down by the occupant. Engine 71's crew checked for extension and verified the fire was out. The scene was turned over to Entiat Fire department. Incident is under investigation by the Entiat Fire department.
