Regular Meeting Call to Order: Commissioner Jones called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

Fire Chief Report: (Chief Asher)

2022 Budget & Financials:

• Looking at November Financials we are very close to where we should be for the end of the year. We still have \$64,581 in state mobe funds to receive. The financials show that were at 95% Keep in mind this also includes the \$500,000 that was not budgeted for, of the down payment for the 2 Urban Interface Engines.

Emergency Response Reports:

- November Incident Response Report shows 103 calls for emergency service with our 10-year average call volume for November at 59 calls. Increase of 39% over last November.
- Rescue/EMS responses accounted for 61% of total calls for service with 28% of those non-transport (including patients who died at the scene) or patient-transported POV.
- Ordered equipment (lift tool) for POV accidents. Cost estimate \$600
- November turnout and response times (primary apparatus at Station 71) are within established service delivery goals as set out in SOG 010.
- Effective Work Force: was acceptable with no major responses within District.
- Total fire loss for November was 0 within FD7

Administration:

- We are still waiting on our WSRB rating score from our eval two months ago. They called yesterday and are waiting for one form from the City of Chelan in regard to the city inspection plan.
- Administration is working on the newsletter that will be generated in January.
- Staff was able to put together a great awards/social event at The Landing.

- Chief Asher and Assistant Chief Sherman attended Recruit Graduation in Wenatchee. Our recruits had high praise. They received or were a part of every special award that was given for the academy. Our two attendees received awards from the academy.
- Chief Asher participated in Recruit and Retention Coordinator interviews for CCFD#3
- Chief Asher participated in Battalion Chief interviews for MLFD.
- Submitted our wish list to Rocky Pond Winery who are wanting to help out local emergency services. On the list are urban interface engines, side-by-side, chain saws, and jet ski water craft.

Operations:

- FF Preheim is back on shift and is currently on A-shift.
- Chief Asher attended the Hazmat Technician Training meeting. Dates are being planned for February 2023.
- Rivercom911's next major project is the Slide Ridge Repeater which should help up-lake on Fire 1 and 2. Also should help in the upper Entiat.

Community Risk Reduction:

• Seasonal safety tips out on our reader board and FB.

Apparatus Status:

- T74 is back in service.
- Brindlee Mountain has sent a couple of truck specs for review. One trucks could possibly work for a type 3 brush engine.
- We will be utilizing the 2022-year DNR Phase 2 grant to complete the fittings of the new CH71. Striping/decals have been completed and all lighting/storage/radio has been ordered.
- Old CH71 has been advertised with a bid award scheduled to occur on the 29th. We can discuss a
 minimum but most bids are over our asking price. We plan to put these funds into the capital
 reserve fund for future apparatus and equipment needs.

Stations:

- Station 71 flooring people have still not come and finished their punch list. Getting some clarification on some numbers but planning on getting it on the schedule for early 2023 before Wildland Season. Estimate \$35,000 to finish the downstairs.
- Commissioner Moller suggested putting a clause in the next contract to complete the punch list before we make full payment.
- Chief Asher is researching a \$30,000 block grant for station design and development.
- Mechanic John Goyne is currently in Spokane finding a replacement oil pump for the heater at St. 74. This is very unique part to replace.
- The USFS (forest service) advised me last week that they are no longer interested in St. 74.

Long-Range Discussion:

- Any long-range topics that have been brought to attention? Possible partial funding to Manson Fire training facility.
- Commissioner Jones would like to have a retreat meeting and have Chelan County and the City of Chelan represent at the meeting.
- Chief Asher did attend the City of Chelan airport meeting. Water implementation will start sometime in 2023.
- Chief Asher reported we budget \$5000 for training prop. At this time, we will not utilize the funds for props at station 74. Chief Asher suggested we continue to have the line item and review facility cost with fire 5 as a long-range plan.

- Commissioner Moller is in favor of looking into the fire 5 training facility.
- Chief Asher will bring more information in the near future to the commissioners.
- Until we have a full understanding of the facility and funding we can plan for the future.
- A priority of replacement of apparatus a Type 3 Brush Chassis Down Payment. Calendar yr 23 (model yr. 24) are all taken. Calendar year 24 (model yr. 25) has not been announced or priced. They are going to let Chief Asher know what the down payment to hold a chassis is once the price is announced. A calendar yr. 23 chassis is \$126,841. The build-out at Cascade Fire is approx. another \$80,000. Looking at what a minim down is to hold the truck and purchase in 2025.

Assistant Fire Chief Report (Asst. Chief Sherman)

• Volunteer Recruitment / Training

Assistant Fire Chief Sherman reported a new volunteer Conner Stephens is in the process and David Holmes has returned. Retention we currently have not lost anyone.

Events – The volunteer academy is scheduled to start on February 7, 2023. Conner Stephens, Tyler Fogelson, and Ben Barns will be in attendance.

Wyatt Dietrich is participating in the stipend shifts.
