Regular Meeting Call to Order: Chairman Jones called the meeting to order at 15:00

Fire Chief Report: (Chief Asher)

2024 Budget & Financials:

April Financials- Looking good. The higher line items are to be expected for this time of year. Annual
memberships are due, and we had to purchase Laptops that failed.

Emergency Response Reports:

- The April Incident Response Report shows 82 calls for emergency service, with our 10-year average call
 volume for April at 71 calls.
- Rescue/EMS responses accounted for 64% of total calls for service with 12% of those non-transport (includes patients who died at scene) or patient-transported POV which is a bit lower than normal.
- Major incidents for April: 2nd alarm fire in Orondo
- April turnout and response times (primary apparatus at Station 71) are within established service delivery goals as set out in SOG 010
- Effective Work Force: Effective workforce was acceptable for call types. Total fire loss for April in district
- Chief Asher will meet with Chief Oatey to review the first alarm run cards with Douglas 4 so that we can better assist each other.
- Chief Mentioned we will review our water rescue run cards to help support the adjacent fire districts.

Administration:

ESO migration is ongoing. Chief Asher spent 2 weeks trying to get the program close to operation with
little success. It will cost us more, and Chief Asher recommends going to a different software company.
Fire Districts Grant 5, Grant 3, LWFR, and CCFD8 all have the same customer service issues with ESO.
We will be demoing First Due tomorrow at 0900. It is built by FFs and is also an all-in-one program.





- The Hazard Mitigation Plan and CWPP updates are still being processed. These occur multiple Thursdays
 each month. Chief Asher, Chief Baker, Casey Tjeerdsma from the City of Chelan, and Jake from DNR had
 a focus workgroup on our area. This is a big project that is taking a lot of my time.
- Chief Asher hasn't heard any updates from the City of Chelan on any grant applications that they are applying for.
- The Fire District was audited by the Department of Retirement, and corrections are being made. Seasonal firefighters are eligible for PERS2/3. A volunteer firefighter who works over the 20% threshold of a career firefighter wage is eligible for PERS2/3. Commissioners who are retired and receive DRS retirement are eligible to report. The DCP employer benefits are reportable to DRS programs LEOFF and PERS. The fire district will be responsible for the employer portion of funds for the corrections being made.
- Chief Asher reported we have one annexation in the Knapps Coulee area. The notification signs are posted
 on the property. A Public Hearing is scheduled for July 17, 2024.
- Wenatchee Valley Fire Department is shutting down its resident program. They put in \$350-500,000 a year
 and have only had 2 people complete their 2-year commitment. It's not worth their effort. This may affect
 whether WVC will continue its Fire Science program.
- Captain Jones is on light duty due to an injury. Chief Sherman has assigned light tasks for Captain Jones.

Operations:

- Micah Satterfield worked one shift and got hired full-time at Grant County Fire District #3 Quincy.
 Houston Stodghill is back in the area for the summer, so the seasonal position was offered to him since he is an EMT and performed well last year.
- We may have to pay to update our RIT bottles to work with the new SCBA upgrades. Orondo is fighting
 that charge, as we all assumed it was covered when the packs were purchased.

Community Risk Reduction/Events:

- Crews were present for Earth Day with the new engine and 1083. Thank you to the Association. It was a
 good turnout by all.
- The new engine was in the Cinco de Mayo parade. It was well attended.
- The new engine 79 was also in the Manson Apple Blossom Parade this weekend. Lots of positive feedback from the citizens.

Apparatus Status:

- Jason Miller and Russ Jones have finished the upgrades to BT71. It is back on the water and ready to go.
- We're still waiting on the new turrent for B71.
- E71 has been running great for the crews. No major issues have come up. We're working on shortening the time it takes for the engine brake to come on.
- E79 (#2 Spartan) came in late last Thursday. Jason Miller has been finishing up a few items and will start working on tool installation and other items.
- The old E71 will be moved to ST74 and become E74.
- E73 So far, we have not had any interest. It is listed at \$60,000. I may consider lowering it.
- The Sheriff's boat has been moved out of ST. 72, so we will move that engine down there, so Jason Miller has more space.

Stations:

- Station 71 generator update. No update
- Station 75 short plot was completed by Chief Sherman.

Chief Asher— Chelan PUD is considering area-wide power outages during wind events. They want the program in place this year. The PUD has criteria for messaging the public.
